Meeting Minutes

- Approved meeting minutes from last meeting
- MNCPPC attendee could not make it – might be rescheduled for April meeting.

HES

- PGCPs will return to EFTF meeting in May to brief on demo timeline
- Any help needed moving things out of the school? Amy will confirm with PTA.
 - o Teachers have been told they need to start packing some things up before the end of school, assuming timeline is very tight
 - o Some of the media center texts will not go with HES to the swing space (or maybe all)
- Principal will kick off community engagement within the next 3 weeks
 - o EFTF could offer zoom link and use for April meeting – will verify date and availability with Dr. McKee
 - o McKee tentatively scheduled April 30th at 5pm
 - o EFTF April meeting rescheduled to April 30, exact time TBD
- EFTF and PGCPs to give update to Council before demolition – needs to be scheduled (probably post May election meeting, May 19)
 - o Council may want someone on the stakeholder committee
 - o Dan will connect with Joanne to confirm a date and see if PGCPs can tie in (mostly concerned about traffic and site/construction management)
 - o Hal will get clarification on when new council members will be sworn in so presentation can happen after that
 - o Alternatively, a written update can be provided and delivered by Clerk to Council.

State Budget

- Anticipated cuts and lost revenue with total \$3B to close the gap. Deficit projected to maybe go up to \$6B next year. This is a potential loss to school construction budget reduction.
 - Current budget is \$100M for PGCPs for repairs and new condition. Deficit for those things is over \$8B.
 - Dan has been working with delegates on how to increase revenue streams for school construction? Working with Delegate Martinez on a bill that taxes social media to benefit mental health provisions for students.
 - Options to make committee business or reach out to Dan offline about joining efforts
 - Youth Advisory Council went to Annapolis on Monday to protest money from casinos to make up revenue losses.
