 - a. BOSE is currently conducting a thorough review and research project in order to formulate a recommendation from BOSE around RCV
 - b. Get on the schedule around March/April 2026 to share initial research and thoughts (not necessarily recommendation – share what the timeframe might be on making a recommendation).
 - c. Research so far has shown a variety of different municipalities and methodologies for the analysis
 - d. Nicola has done research on College Park, MD as a case study – is this the same kind of case study approach we want to take for other municipalities?
 - e. ACTION: Create a project management timeline for research (ERIN)
 - f. Zach reached out to Dan for underlying data to compare his data with what Nate/Laura had – 90% is congruent between the two data sets but should be able to resolve it.
